### Closing Prayer **Psalm 18**<sup>[a]</sup>

- <sup>1</sup> I love you, Lord, my strength.

my shield<sup>[b]</sup> and the horn<sup>[c]</sup> of my salvation, my stronghold.

### Between Sessions

Write a letter to Jesus about His all-sufficiency. Tell Him in which area you are struggling in and ask Him to give you guidance.
